With the Cat Care Sanctuary open and successfully running, I look forward to resuming my TNR (Trap-Neuter/Spay-Release) program out on location in the Four Corners area. After one of the most exploding kitten seasons in history, I realize the gigantic need to work on the feral cat colonies in order to reduce their amount of growth and also, hopefully, lower the kitten population. I personally had over 150 kittens in foster care this summer

#### **BOARDING AVAILABLE!**

Our sanctuary is set up with a private room reserved just for "guest" cats coming in while their owners enjoy a little time away!

As shown in the photo, each cat will enjoy a double-decker, securely enclosed haven with plenty of room to exercise, play through my Cat Care program.

When trapping the large colonies, we pull the dominant cats out on the first trapping and then return the next day for those who remained in the colonies. All cats are vaccinated, spayed/neutered through our partnership with the local DSNIP program, ear clipped, held 48 hours and then returned. With control on reproduction in the cat colonies, these cats will thrive in their environment, keep down the rodent/reptile population, maintain their colony size, and it will also help reduce roaming to other locations. A male cat will travel up to 20 miles to impregnate a female.

The numbers over the past years have shown this method to be a proven success. I have personally recorded my 45,000 TNR's over the last 20 years which has made a contribution to the reduced kitten population in La Plata County in past years. We have created the Michelle Brawley Memorial TNR Fund if you are interested in specifically donating to the TNR aspect of our organization. Your consideration is greatly appreciated.
